GOSPEL DISCUSSION

In this gospel story, Jesus is fishing for information - what are people saying about him? Who do they think he is? The disciples all have a go at answering but it is Peter who comes up with the correct answer: 'You are the Messiah'.

Peter is a key character in this story and also in Matthew's gospel. Who was Peter that Jesus chose him to be the leader of the community? What sort of man was he? Was he a great, faith-filled, strong and courageous man? Peter was a fisherman. He had a wife and maybe a family. He was called by Jesus, along with other disciples, to be 'fishers of people'. Like the other men disciples, Peter often found it hard to understand Jesus and his message.

In this story, Jesus calls him 'the rock', suggesting that Peter's faith was strong and unwavering. When Jesus went into the garden to pray, Peter was one of three disciples with Jesus, who fell asleep! He failed to understand or attend to Jesus' need for support and comfort. When men came to arrest Jesus, it was Peter who cut off the ear of the high priest's servant. Jesus admonished Peter saying, if you live by the sword, you'll die by the sword! And after Jesus was arrested in the garden, it was Peter who three times denied even knowing Jesus! These are not the actions of a man with strong and unwavering faith! These are the actions of a very human Peter. Recall the story from two weeks ago when Peter tried to walk on water to Jesus - his faith let him down!

Peter failed often but he kept coming back. It is easy to see aspects of ourselves in Peter - the doubt, the uncertainty, the fear, the lack of understanding, the shame. Peter was fully human, as we are. Yet Peter was the one Jesus chose to lead his community. We do not have to be perfect to be a disciple or a leader! We just need to hang in there and stick with Jesus, to the bitter end! Reflect on the question Jesus asked the disciples - **'Who do you say I am?'**

Jesus is God's Son.

SOCIAL JUSTICE STATEMENT 2023-24

Listen, Learn, Love

A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples

With a tradition stretching back to 1940, the Australian Bishops Conference contributes to the development of local Catholic Social Teaching by releasing a major social justice statement each year in the lead up to Social Justice Sunday, which this year falls on Sunday 27 August. These statements encourage the Catholic community to reflect and act on the social, economic and ecological aspects of the Church's mission.

The title of the Social Justice Statement 2023-24 is <u>Listen, Learn</u>, <u>Love: A new engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander</u> <u>Peoples</u>. It includes experiences and views shared by the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) and calls for the Church – and society more widely – to listen to, engage and address the pain of First Nations Peoples in new ways, in order to bring an end to centuries of injustice.

"In this time of renewal in the Church and in our country, we invite everyone to join us in walking with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people on this journey of healing."
