GOSPEL DISCUSSION

Yet again the Pharisees try to test Jesus by asking him which is the greatest commandment. This is an easy one for Jesus! First of all you must love God (here he quotes Deuteronomy 6:5) and secondly, you must love your neighbour (here he quotes Leviticus 19:18). The two commands go together and form the basis of the entire Scriptures... it's that easy!

Loving, of course, is not easy. It can be quite demanding. Recall 1 Corith 13. Love is patient and kind, never jealous or boastful or rude. Love never seeks its own advantage. To love is to trust, to hope, to endure whatever comes. Take some time to explore some of these concepts with the children.

Discussion:

-Describe the love your parents have for you.

-Describe the love God has for you.

-Share stories about the way other people have demonstrated their love for you.

-Compile a simple list of 'Love is...' statements.

-Discuss the ways we can show our love for others through our words. Give some examples - 'You look great today!' / 'Thank you' / 'I forgive you' / 'Cheer up mate'.

-Discuss the ways we can show our love for others through our actions.

-Discuss the ways we can show our love for God. Share any stories about people who did great or courageous things for God.


