You must call no one on earth your father, since you have only one Father, and he is in heaven. Nor must you allow yourselves to be called teachers, for you have only one Teacher, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Anyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and anyone who humbles himself will be exalted.'

GOSPEL DISCUSSION

The Scribes and the Pharisees were recognised experts on Scripture. But when it came to applying the laws and regulations to everyday life, then the problems began. To follow the letter of the law meant following thousands and thousands of rules and regulations - an impossible task and an intolerable burden. Jesus was more concerned with adherence to the spirit of the law.

Jesus referred to the religious leaders as hypocrites - people who said one thing and did something different. Nothing is ever achieved by pretending to be something we are not!

Think about the sort of person you believe yourself to be. If you were asked to write a profile of yourself - what would you say?

Describe what a Christian looks like. How do Christians live? What is important to them? How do they treat other people? Talk about what it means to be 'sincere'. Give some examples of sincere, genuine behaviour.





What is Prison Sunday?

In The Year of Mercy (2016), Pope Francis instituted Prison Sunday. The first Sunday of November is now internationally recognised in this way. We come together to remember our brothers and sisters who are incarcerated around the world. It is a powerful witness to our faith to turn our minds towards those who are separated from families and communities and to let them know they are not forgotten. They remain part of The Body of Christ and despite the separation, a part of our society.

What role do Prison Chaplains play?

Prison chaplains visit people of their own faith tradition, other traditions or spiritualities and no faith background. They offer a listening ear and companionship to those they meet. They provide a trusted, confidential person to talk to. Someone to share their worries and concerns for themselves, their situation and their families. Not uncommonly, chaplains hear that to have someone listen to them, really listen, is empowering and sadly not familiar. Having their life story validated, not judged, helps them to feel respected and worthy.

An experienced chaplain reminds residents "I came to visit you, not your crime." Most times chaplains are unaware of the crime or alleged crime, that sees the person in prison. We are reminded that, but for a different upbringing, or opportunities in life, we all have the potential to make a poor choice and find ourselves in prison. "Where might I be if your story was my story?"

Post release support is an area of great need we would love to develop within our communities.
