A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in the proper order: Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death. And when everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will be subject in his turn to the One who subjected all things to him, so that God may be all in all.

Gospel

Matthew 25:31-46

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'

GOSPEL DISCUSSION

Jesus tells us most clearly in this gospel passage that the mark of a true disciple is a compassionate response to people's needs.

'I was hungry and you fed me. I was thirsty and you gave me a drink' People hunger and thirst for - food, respect, shelter, a job, peace, happiness, a word of encouragement, forgiveness. There are many needs and many ways in which we can respond to people's needs. It may not involve major projects - it may be a simple as a smile or a friendly word of affirmation or gratitude.

'I was a stranger and you welcomed me.' Hospitality is a key gospel value. The welcoming of strangers is about our attitude to those who are different from us - be it in looks, religion, culture, speech or talent! Being different is not dangerous!

'I was naked and you clothed me'. To be naked is to be without... without self-esteem, without love, without security, without peace of mind. Similarly, one 'clothes' another with friendship, with encouragement, with affirmation, with a good reputation, with speaking the truth.

'I was sick and you took care of me'. There are many forms of illness that afflict people today. Recently, a psychologist specializing in adolescence stated that one in five Australian students suffer some form of psychological problem. One of the solutions, he stated, was to instill in students a sense of meaning and belonging.

'I was a prisoner and you visited me.' What is it that binds us and prevents us from growing and living 'life to the full' (John 10:10)? Fear can bind us, so can guilt or loneliness or insecurity.

Jesus wants us to show our care for other people in real and meaningful ways.


