Gospel

John 1:6-8, 19-28

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light. This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied: a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you unknown to you the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

During Advent, we remember how John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus.

The first reading comes from the prophet Isaiah who said that the Spirit of God had chosen him for a special job. The Spirit of God chooses each one of us for a special job also. We are given gifts and talents to use to make our world a better place.

Think of your gifts, especially the gifts of listening, being friendly, being patient, being thoughtful. How gifts like these help to make the world a happier place for everyone?

The psalmist prays, 'With all my heart I will praise the Lord.' Remember to always give thanks to God for everything we have. There are many children in our world today who are very sick, who have no homes and no families, and who go to bed hungry each and every day.

In the gospel story today we hear how the religious leaders questioned John the Baptist about his identity. They were unsure about who he was or what his mission was. Some thought he might be the messiah or one of the Old Testament prophets. John assured the people that his job was to help the people get ready for Jesus. This is why God had chosen him. God chooses us also to continue this mission.

Pray together that your family will be led to recognize that Jesus is present among us.

The third Sunday of Advent is also called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete, a Latin word which means "rejoice," is taken from the entrance antiphon for Sunday's Mass. It is a reminder that Advent is a season of joy because our salvation is already at hand.




