

Sundown on Holy Thursday to sundown on Easter Sunday are the three most mysterious and heart-breakingly beautiful days in the Liturgical Calendar. The word "triduum" (pronounced "TRID-yoo-um") comes from the two latin words meaning "three" and "days".

- Buy nothing for three days
- Make hot crossed buns

Holy Thursday

This day recalls the Last Supper when Jesus washed the feet of his disciples. It reminds us that we are called to serve one another. Here are some ideas for celebrating the day

- Go to Mass: The Holy Thursday liturgy marks the beginning of the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. At the end of Mass, join in the procession to move the Blessed Sacrament to an altar of repose.
- Help someone: Do something special for someone in need.

Good Friday

LIGHT: 8 Tealights + Christ Candle

PRAY: God of life and death, forgive what we have done and what we have left undone. Forgive the suffering we have caused and the suffering we have neglected to see, the resurrections we have overlooked and the resurrections we have neglected to be . Amen

EXTINGUISH: 8 Tealights + Christ Candle

READ: Psalm 51:1-15

REFLECT: God, create a clean heart in me.

BLESS: May God bless you and keep you as you sit in the shadow of death. May resurrection be your hope, today and everyday. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Holy Saturday

Spend some time as a family talking about the Paschal Mystery — Jesus' crucifixion, death and resurrection. This day commemorates the time of darkness and waiting when Jesus was in the tomb. The Easter Vigil begins with the symbol of fire. Talk about how fire represents that Jesus is the light of the world. He brings light to the darkness and new life to a sleeping world.


