### **Marian Procession**

The 75<sup>th</sup> Marian Procession will be held on <u>Sunday May 19</u> beginning 2pm at Victoria Park processing up Wakefield Street into Victoria Square. Group assembly at 1:30pm.

### We encourage you to attend!

The Marian Procession began in 1949 and is the longest running consecutive Catholic event in Australia. This year the Procession celebrates 75 years and will continue its path in the streets of the Adelaide CBD. It began and flourished at the Rostrevor Seminary and has since been hosted in an array of venues such as various parklands throughout the CBD, the Adelaide Showgrounds and once in the Cathedral due to inclement weather.

The Marian Procession is a wonderful opportunity to gather communities together and provide a prayerful experience with Mary at the centre. For the first time, we will not gather behind community/parish signs provided by the Archdiocese, rather focus on walking together, as One Church.

Each year a different Marian image or theme is selected for the Procession aimed to highlight a feast or event within the Catholic Church or celebrate a local community or parish. This year, we celebrate the Marian Procession on Pentecost Sunday.

The Procession is followed by a time of prayer, a reflection on the Gospel, a collection and concludes with benediction.

The simplicity has always been and will remain in the act of gathering, praying the rosary and coming together in community to be a public witness of our Catholic faith.
